CHELSEA FILM FESTIVAL ANNOUNCES EARLY SUBMISSIONS DEADLINES

Chelsea, NY — The Chelsea Film Festival (CFF) announces today its early submissions deadlines.

The official submission deadline is Thursday, March 30, 2017 with a late submission deadline of Wednesday, May 31, 2017. The following are our deadlines and fees for this year:

Early Submission Deadline:

Monday, January 30, 2017

U.S. & INTERNATIONAL FEATURE FILMS and DOCUMENTARIES – \$45 entry fee

U.S. & INTERNATIONAL SHORT FILMS – \$35 entry fee

Official Submission Deadline:

Thursday, March 30, 2017

U.S. & INTERNATIONAL FEATURE FILMS and DOCUMENTARIES – \$70 entry fee

U.S. & INTERNATIONAL SHORT FILMS – \$55 entry fee

Late Submission Deadline:

Wednesday, May 31, 2017

U.S. & INTERNATIONAL FEATURE FILMS and DOCUMENTARIES – \$90 entry fee

U.S. & INTERNATIONAL SHORT FILMS – \$75 entry fee

Extended Submission Deadline:

Friday, July 28, 2017
